Ron Cameron Foundation Awards Scholarship

(Kennett Square, PA) – The Ron Cameron Foundation awarded its first scholarship dedicated to attracting the best young talent to the mechanical and construction trades.

Clark of Chadds Ford, Pa, a graduating senior from Unionville High School (UHS), Unionville, PA was presented the first Ron Cameron Memorial Scholarship, which includes a \$1,000 grant to continue his studies at the Pennsylvania College of Technology in Williamsport, PA (Penn State affiliate) in a Residential Construction Management curriculum, a commemorative plaque, and an invitation to the 2nd annual Remembering Ron Cameron Golf Outing June 6, 2007 a Loch Nairn Golf Club in Avondale, PA where Benjamin and his achievement will again be recognized. The scholarship was awarded at the UHS Senior Awards Ceremony on May 23, 2007 by Ron's twin sister Heather and James Fulginiti, Principal and one of Ron's former teachers, who reminisced fondly teaching Ron over twenty years ago while announcing the award.

The Ron Cameron Memorial Scholarship, in memory of the late Ronald W. Cameron who passed away March 20, 2006 at the age of 38, recognizes excellence, a passion for the trades and a strong work ethic. Charitable donations to the Ron Cameron Foundation and proceeds from the annual golf outing and other events are directed to The Ron Cameron Memorial Scholarship Fund. Scholarships are awarded annually to deserving students aspiring to a career in the mechanical trades or construction. Ron attended a technical school after graduating from UHS in 1986 and chose his career in the HVAC Industry, in which he worked his entire life. Ron was passionate in giving 110% all the time no matter what the task until the task was complete. He had an excellent work ethic and was a valued friend, co-worker and employee everywhere he worked.
